Gillian Burnett, who set up a taxi service solely for women called Driving Miss Daisy, picked up the Customer Service Award.

The business woman, who runs the taxi service in Burnopfield, County Durham, said: "I'm very, very humbled to by it all because there's some amazing women here."

Tyne Tees Model boss Lesley Middlemiss Lister was handed the Collaboration of the Year gong for her success in the world of modelling, including setting up the first nationally-recognised accredited training course for modelling with Northumberland College.

The Woman of the Year was named as Eileen Richardson who was diagnosed with breast cancer 27 weeks

into her pregnancy with triplets. She had to endure a premature labour and instantly afterwards had to undergo surgery for her cancer. Ten years on and Eileen is now helping to support other suffers with her Hug in a Bag charity in Sunderland.

Success of the Year went to Nicky Gray and Susan Tonks who set up Fidgets, The Salon for Kids in Whitley Bay to make the lives of children with sensory difficulties easier.

The Lifetime Achievement Award was so hotly disputed by the judges that they eventually decided two of the finalists deserved to be honoured.

Helen McArdle, who runs Helen McArdle Care, received the prize alongside Katherine Sloane, owner of Katherine's Florists.

Picking up the award Helen said: "I was thrilled to be shortlisted and I'm absolutely delighted to win it."

Katherine said: "I set up Katherine's Florists in 1970 and I took three pound six shilling on the first day. It's been an amazing journey so today is an opportunity to say thank you."
